You Only Live Once

AKA Zindagi Na Milegi Dobara

India - 2019 Comedy / Drama / Music

This film's story follows three childhood friends, Arjun, Kabir, and Imran, who reunite for a three-week road trip. They set off to Spain and meet Laila, who falls in love with Arjun and helps him overcome his compulsion to work. Kabir and his fiancée Natasha experience significant misunderstandings, while Imran wishes to meet his biological father, an artist. During their trip, each friend chooses a dangerous sport for the group to partake in; Deep sea diving, skydiving and the running of the bulls in Pamplona. The sport challenges provide a wealth of opportunity for both comedy and drama. The film had a worldwide release in 2011 and was a critical and popular success in India. (155 minutes. -There will be a 15 minute intermission)

Friday, October 7

Delicious

France/Belgium - 2021 Comedy / Drama / History

The setting for this film is France in 1789, just before the Revolution. The prestige of a noble house depends above all on the quality of its table. At the dawn of the French Revolution, gastronomy still is a prerogative of the aristocrats. When talented cook Manceron is dismissed by the Duke of Chamfort, he loses the taste for cooking. Back in his country house, his meeting with the mysterious and surprising Louise gets him back on his feet. While they both feed a desire of revenge against the Duke, they decide to create the very first restaurant in France. (112 minutes)

The Boy who Harnessed the Wind

Malawi - 2019

Biography / Drama / History

Against all the odds, a thirteen-year-old boy in Malawi invents an unconventional way to save his family and village from famine. This film is based on the true story of William Kamkwamba, who was born in the country of Malawi, in Africa. When he was fourteen years old, a terrible drought hit the village where he lived. People had nothing to eat. Being an excellent student and very fond of physics, William decides to save his native village from starvation and searches the library to find books on physics. After studying, he gets the idea to build a wind generator and provide electricity to his family. (III minutes)

Friday, January 6

The Life Ahead

Italy - 2020 Drama

In seaside Italy, a Holocaust survivor with a day-care business takes in a 12-year-old street kid who recently robbed her. Rosa (Sophia Loren) and Momo develop a deep bond, and after he becomes her only ward he quits selling drugs. Although her health is declining, Rosa asks Momo to promise to keep her out of the hospital as she is terrified because she was medically experimented on as a child in the Auschwitz concentration camp. Momo agrees and promises, and a one point sneaks her out of the hospital and hides her. Momo stays there with Rosa, caring for her. Will their secnet be discovered? (94 minutes)

Friday, February 3

Fisherman's Friends

United Kingdom - 2019 Comedy / Drama / Music

A fast living, cynical London music executive (Daniel Mays) heads to a remote Cornish village on a stag weekend where he's pranked by his boss (Noel Clarke) into trying to sign a group of shanty singing fishermen (led by James Purefoy). He becomes the ultimate "fish out of water" as he struggles to gain the respect or enthusiasm of the unlikely boy band and their families (including Tuppence Middleton) who value friendship and community over fame and fortune. As he's drawn deeper into the traditional way of life he's forced to reevaluate his own integrity and ultimately question what success really means. (112 minutes)

Friday, March 3

Georgia/Russia/Bulgaria - 2021 Comedy / Drama

In this portrait of parental sacrifice and the love of a father for his son, former wrestler Kakhi (played by real-life Olympic champion Levan Tediashvili) embarks on a journey from his home in the Republic of Georgia to visit his son Soso in the Russian-speaking neighborhood of Brighton Beach, Brooklyn of New York City. There he finds his son living in a shabby boarding house populated by a colorful group of fellow Georgian immigrants. Soso is not studying medicine, as Kakhi believed, but is working for a moving company and has accrued a \$14,000 gambling debt to a local Russian mob boss. Kakhi sets his mind to helping his hapless son out of his debt, leading to situations as often comic as they are dire. (90 minutes)

Friday, April 7

Brighton 4th Indian Horse

Canada - 2017 Drama

This is the story of young Saul Indian Horse, and his journey through every stereotypical and racist obstacle imaginable. As an indigenous Canadian Saul survives residential school and life amongst the racism of the 1970's. Seemingly on his way to stardom as a talented hockey player, backed by the support of his dream and fellow indigenous teammates belief, the battles continue to develop, and overtime turns him towards the very stereotypes he so desperately fought to overcome. Winner of 10 international awards. (101 minutes)

Due to the variety of languages and accents represented, as well as accommodation for the hearing impaired, all films are shown with English subtitles.

Thursday, April 20 at 7:30 p.m. - Orringer Auditorium


Join the North Carolina Baroque Orchestra as they explore musical cross pollination and outsider composers. Some of these composers spent time away from their birth countries, learning from, being inspired by, and imitating composers in the lands they visited, and some of the works come from composers who were "outsiders" by dint of race or gender.

From the traveling musicians, you will hear the influences of their birth places, along with new influences from their adventures to other lands. Georg Frideric Handel was born in Germany, studied and made his first mark in Italy, spent his career in England. Willem de Fesch of the Netherlands joined Handel's orchestra in London. Jean-Baptiste Lully, consummate Frenchman was born Giovanni Battista Lulli in Italy. Joseph Bologne, Chevalier de Saint-Georges traveled from his birthplace, the French colony of Guadeloupe, to France. Born to a French planter and an enslaved African woman, Chevalier de Saint-Georges gained his education and his musical training in France. Elisabeth Jacquet de la Guerre, though living her life in France, made a place for herself as one of the very few women in professional music life in France.

All of the featured composers wrote music that was vivid, charming, exciting and moving. NCBO will bring you a lively and engaging evening of musical storytelling.

The Malpass Brothers are the real deal, folks. You'll find no pretense with this act as their music is steeped in the legacy of the Louvin Brothers, Johnny Cash, Marty Robbins, and Hank Williams, Sr. They have opened for Merle Haggard, and shared billing with Willie Nelson, Rhonda Vincent, Marty Stuart, and Doc Watson. Hailing from Goldsboro, NC, the duo made their Grand Old Opry debut in 2018 and have performed in halls and at festivals from the Shetland Islands to Merlefest, and throughout North and South Carolina, Tennessee, and Texas.

Day and Regional Trip Registration

Enrollment space for LLC day trips and regional travel programs is limited to the capacity of our motorcoach, the availability of tickets and other booking factors associated with group admissions. To reserve a place on any of these trips, ALL fees must be paid at the time of registration. Early registration is highly recommended as the trips tend to "sell out" very quickly.

USA Adventures and International Travel

Registration deposits, fees and final payments for out-of-state or out-of-country travel where the LLC contracts with a tour company will follow a payment schedule specific to each trip. Many of the payments for these trips are paid directly to one of our group travel partners. Rules for refunds and the specific details for each trip will be posted on our website.

Please note that Craven Community College requires that each person participating in an extended trip must sign a liability waiver and purchase cancellation and post-departure emergency insurance. We offer a reasonably priced option with each trip that we sponsor. Participants who have other travel insurance coverage may opt-out of our offer, but they are required to provide Craven Community College with proof of insurance that specifically documents insurance coverage equivalent to our minimum standards.

Refund Policy

Tickets purchased for Explorations in The ARTS events or our Performance Day Trips are not refundable. However, the tickets or registrations are transferable. If you are unable to attend an event that you have registered and paid for, you are welcome to share your tickets or transfer the registration to another person.

One-to four-day trip registration fees are not refundable. These are the only exceptions: I) the predetermined minimum enrollment is not met, and the trip is cancelled due to low enrollment; or 2) the college, or the performance, or exhibit venue determines that due to threatening weather or unsafe conditions we must cancel a trip or performance. No refunds will be offered if a new date is selected and the program is completed as advertised.

There are no refunds offered after an event has occurred. A refund of fees to a registered participant will only occur when a cancellation is made in advance of the event AND a replacement from the waiting list registers for the open spot. We understand that "life happens," so please contact us as soon as possible if last-minute circumstances arise. We often have an extensive waiting list for each day trip and we will attempt to fill a spot if we are notified.
