

Friday, September 8

Lunana: A Yak in the Classroom

2019 - Bhutan / Dongkha Family Drama / Comedy - NR

A young teacher in modern Bhutan shirks his duties while planning to go to Australia to become a singer. As a reprimand, his superiors send him to the most remote school in the world, a glacial Himalayan village called Lunana. After an arduous 8 day trek just to get to the village, he finds himself exiled from his Westernized comforts. There he finds no electricity, no textbooks, not even a blackboard. Though poor, the villagers extend a warm welcome to their new teacher, but he faces the daunting task of teaching the children without supplies. He wants to quit and go home, but he begins to fall in love with the children he teaches and transforms through the amazing spiritual strength of the villagers. (110 minutes)

Friday, October 6 Lemon Tree

2008 - Israel / Arabic and Hebrew Biography / Drama - NR

Salma Zidane, a widow, lives simply through her grove of lemon trees in the West Bank's occupied territory. The Israeli defense minister and his wife move next door and then the Secret Service orders the trees removed for security. The stoic Salma seeks assistance from the Palestinian Authority (useless), Israeli army (dismissive), and a young attorney, Ziad Daud, who takes the case: this older client attracts him. While the courts deliberate, the Israelis fence her trees and prohibit her from entering the grove. As the trees wither, the defense minister's wife and, separately, an Israeli journalist, look on Salma with sympathy. In this allegory, does David stand a chance against Goliath? (107 minutes)

Friday, November 3 **Argentina, 1985**

2022 - Argentina / Spanish Biography / Crime / Drama - R

Based on real events, this film follows the events surrounding the 1985 trial of the Juntas, which prosecuted the ringleaders of Argentina's last civilmilitary dictatorship (1976–1983). The film centers on the titanic work of a group of non-lawyers aged 20 to 27, who are led by prosecutors Julio César Strassera and Luis Moreno Ocampo against those responsible for the bloodiest dictatorship in the history of Argentina. The narration reflects on the true meaning in the concepts of memory, truth, and justice under the slogan "Nunca más" ('Never again') The film debuted at number one at the Argentine box office and became the most-watched Argentine film of 2022. (140 minutes)

Friday, January 5 Seducing Dr. Lewis

2003 - Canada / French Comedy - NR

A much-needed boost, in the form of a new factory, is promised to the residents of the tiny fishing village in St. Marie-La-Mauderne, Canada, provided they can lure a doctor to take up fulltime residency on the island. Inspired, the villagers devise a scheme to help Dr. Christopher Lewis choose to stay. Fortunately, the village of St. Marie does have a draw - Eve, a lovely postal worker Eve is the only one in town not trying to seduce Dr. Lewis, though she'd have the most luck. She mocks his superior attitude toward the locals. When he asks what she's reading, she replies that actually she's only capable of looking at the pictures. You know it's only a matter of time before they get together. (87 minutes)

Friday, February 2

Mozart's Sister

2010 - France / French Period Drama - NR

Mozart's Sister is a re-imagined account of the early life of Maria Anna Mozart, the older sister to Wolfgang and a true musical prodigy in her own right. Once the featured performer, she has given way to Wolfgang as the main attraction. Their strict but loving father Leopold tours his talented offspring in front of the royal courts of pre-French Revolution Europe. Approaching marriageable age and now forbidden to play the violin or compose, Maria Anna chafes at the limitations imposed on her gender, but a friendship with the son and daughter of Louis XV offers her ways to challenge the established sexual and social order. (120 minutes)

Friday, March I **Belfast**

2021 - United Kingdom / English Biography / Drama - PG-13

It is 1969 and 9-year-old Buddy finds his peaceful life disturbed as a national conflict is starting to brew in Northern Ireland: unionists and loyalists want the country to remain within the United Kingdom, while nationalists and republicans are campaigning for the country to join a united Ireland. As the tension between these two opposing forces escalates, Buddy's family must decide whether to stay or move somewhere safe. Kenneth Branaugh directs this semi-autobiographical film with an all-star cast including Judi Dench, Ciarian Hinds, and Caitriona Balfe. Belfast is infused with Branagh's love of film and film history. With expressive black & white camera work, he circles the edges of social realism while keeping one foot firmly planted in the world of movies. (98 minutes)

My Wonderful Wanda

2020- Switzerland & Germany / German Comedy / Drama - NR

My Wonderful Wanda is a delightful satire of the haves and the have-nots set against the backdrop of a gorgeous lakeside villa in Switzerland. At the story's center is Wanda, a Polish caretaker who has left her own small children in Poland to look after Josef the stroke-ridden patriarch of the very wealthy Wegmeister-Gloor dynasty. Wanda is adept at navigating the tricky family dynamics between the two grown (if still childish) offspring and the elegant (if controlling) matriarch Elsa, along with the sporadic intervention of animals stuffed or alive. An unexpected turn of events turns everything upside down in this very human comedy. (129 minutes)

GIRL FROM THE NORTH COUNTRY is a love letter to America, celebrating its strength and resilience with the poetry of Bob Dylan's music to unite, heal, uplift, inspire, and illuminate through the darkest of times.

Set in 1934 in the midst of the Great Depression, this musical drama takes place in a guest house inhabited by a collection of wayward souls, some passing and some permanent. At the center is a family, that includes the down-on-his-luck proprietor, a wife with dementia, an alcoholic son, and a pregnant teen daughter. The Depression has certainly taken its toll on those that dwell in the guest house.

Director Conor McPherson deftly uses the music of Bob Dylan with a wealth of actor-musicians playing typical instruments of the 1930s. You'll hear Dylan classics including *Slow Train*, *Like a Rolling Stone*, *Idiot Wind*, *Hurricane*, and *Forever Young*.

THE LION KING has won six 1998 Tony Awards®, including Best Musical and Best Direction of a Musical and is the 1999 Grammy® Award winner for Best Musical Show Album. The Lion King is now the 3rd longest show running in Broadway history.

In the I7th century, Dutch merchants sailed across seas and oceans, joining trade networks that stretched from Asia to the Americas and Africa. The unprecedented movement of goods, ideas, and people fueled the economy and sparked an artistic boom.

We invite you to join us for a very special exhibition at the North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA), *Dutch Art in a Global Age* presents masterpieces from the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, with an innovative focus. Arranged thematically, the exhibition explores the intersections among art, commercial networks, and colonial expansion. The presentation features paintings by Rembrandt, Frans Hals, Gerrit Dou, Jacob van Ruisdael, Rachel Ruysch, and other celebrated artists. It was her pivotal bluegrass album Back Home Again that transformed Rhonda Vincent into the All American Bluegrass Girl, and crowned her the New Queen of Bluegrass by "The Wall Street Journal" in 2000.

Vincent is one of the most recognized female artists in Bluegrass today as winner of the 2017 Grammy for Best Bluegrass Album, an Entertainer of the Year Award in 2001, Song of the Year in 2004, and an unprecedented seven consecutive Female Vocalist of the Year awards from the International Bluegrass Music



Association (IMBA) 2000 – 2006. She received an eighth win of IBMA Female Vocalist of the Year in 2015. Rhonda was officially inducted as a member of the Grand Ole Opry on February 6, 2021.

She is a formidable musician (mandolin, fiddle, guitar, and most anything else with strings) and a remarkable lead singer, able to deliver both overpowering up-tempo numbers and soulful introspective ballads. Her powerful vocal style transcends the boundaries of bluegrass music, as evidenced in her collaboration with Dolly Parton on the Elton John / Bernie Taupin Tribute Project "Restoration" in 2018.







LLC Program Participation & Registration

Day and Regional Trip Registration

Enrollment space for LLC day trips and regional travel programs is limited to the capacity of our motorcoach, the availability of tickets and other booking factors associated with group admissions. To reserve a place on any of these trips, ALL fees must be paid at the time of registration. Early registration is highly recommended as the trips tend to "sell out" very quickly.

USA Adventures and International Travel

Registration deposits, fees and final payments for out-of-state or out-of-country travel where the LLC contracts with a tour company will follow a payment schedule specific to each trip. Payments for these trips are paid directly to one of our group travel partners. Rules for refunds, travel insurance requirements, and the specific details for each trip will be printed in separate tour brochures.

Please note that Craven Community College requires that each person participating in an extended trip must sign a liability waiver and purchase cancellation and post-departure emergency insurance. We offer a reasonably priced option with each trip that we sponsor. Participants who have other travel insurance coverage may opt-out of our offer but they are required to provide Craven Community College with proof of insurance that specifically documents insurance coverage equivalent to our minimum standards.

Refund Policy

Tickets purchased for Explorations in The ARTS events or our Performance Day Trips are NOT refundable. However, tickets and registrations are transferable. If you are unable to attend an event that you have registered and paid for, you are welcome to share your ticket(s) or transfer the registration to another person.

There are no refunds offered after an event has occurred. A **refund of fees** to a registered participant will only occur when a cancellation is made in advance of the event **AND** a replacement from the waiting list registers for the open spot. We understand that "life happens," so **please contact us as soon** as **possible if last-minute circumstances arise.** We often have an extensive waiting list for each trip and we will attempt to fill a spot if we are notified.

One-to four-day trip registration fees are NOT refundable. These are the exceptions: I) the predetermined minimum enrollment is not met and the trip is cancelled due to low enrollment; or 2) the college or the performance/exhibit venue determines that due to threatening weather or unsafe conditions we must cancel. No refunds will be offered if a new date is selected and the program is completed as advertised.
