






EXPLORE A WORLD OF NEW OPPORTUNITIES

By pursuing degrees that include an Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), Associate in Fine Arts (AFA), or Associate in Engineering (AE), as well as two Teacher Preparation programs, students are able to build a foundation for personal growth and development that furthers their educational dreams.

As an accredited college that has served Craven County for more than 50 years, we have established a reputation of providing local education options that are reputable and easily transferable to colleges and universities, particularly those located in North Carolina.





ASSOCIATE IN ARTS

The Associate in Arts (AA) program is designed for students who plan to transfer to a college or university and complete a Bachelor of Arts degree. This degree leads students to develop a strong foundation in English, fine arts/humanities, social/behavioral sciences, mathematics, and natural sciences. The coursework within the AA meets most freshman and sophomore requirements at the baccalaureate level.

ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE

The Associate in Science (AS) program is designed for students who plan to transfer to a college or university and complete a Bachelor of Science degree. The AS degree emphasizes natural science and mathematics and also provides students with a solid foundation in English, fine arts/humanities, and social/behavioral science. Students also take enough elective hours to allow further exploration in areas of interest. The coursework within the ASmeets most freshman and sophomore requirements at the baccalaureate level.

ASSOCIATE IN ENGINEERING

The Associate in Engineering (AE) program is designed to prepare students to transfer into one of the five Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) accredited engineering programs in North Carolina. Coursework includes upper-level mathematics and general education credits, as well as an Intro to Engineering course (EGR 150) that helps students understand the multiple specialties within engineering. Students who complete the AE will be well qualified to apply to any of the engineering programs in NC.

ASSOCIATE IN FINE ARTS

Craven CC offers two Fine Arts degrees: Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts (AFA-Visual) and Associate in Fine Arts in Music (AFA-Music). These programs are designed for students intending to transfer to a four-year university to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree, a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree, or a Bachelor of Music degree. Twenty-eight semester hours are dedicated to a general education core, while 36 hours remain for students to take a deep dive into their study of music or art. The AFA program is also perfect for those wanting a comprehensive study of music or art without pursuing a bachelor's degree.

TEACHER PREPARATION

The Associate in Arts in Teacher Preparation (AATP) and Associate in Science in Teacher Preparation (ASTP) programs are designed to prepare students to transfer to a four-year university to obtain a bachelor's degree in education. Specialized coursework covers multiple grade levels and subjects, ranging from kindergarten through grade 12, as well as hands-on student teaching experience, which is required for licensing in most states.

TRANSFERABILITY

Craven Community College's connections with all North Carolina public colleges and universities, as well as partnerships with many public and private universities within the state, allow Craven CC students to transfer credit hours to pursue a bachelor's or other specialized degree. The high academic standards in our classrooms ensure students can transfer Craven credits to colleges and universities in North Carolina and beyond. Unique student transfer opportunities include the following:

- The Carolina Student Transfer Excellence Program (C-STEP) facilitates high-achieving students in completing an AA or AS at Craven, then transferring to UNC-Chapel Hill to complete a BA or BS.
- East Carolina University's SECU Partnership East allows students to complete an elementary or middle grades teaching degree onsite at Craven Community College's New Bern campus.
- NC State University's engineering partnership allows students to complete a Bachelor of Science in Engineering degree with a concentration in Mechanical Engineering Systems or Electrical Engineering Systems onsite at Craven CC's Havelock campus. Craven is the only community college in North Carolina to offer this opportunity.

Craven CC also has strong partnerships with NC Wesleyan University, UNC Wilmington, and many other public and private educational institutions.

Craven CC recognizes the importance of global connections and honors them with outreach programs across the state and the world. Diversity of cultural expression is central to a liberal arts education, and we embrace the opportunity to help students recognize the interdependency of our global partners.

Our Study Abroad initiative allows students to study in other parts of the world to foster a richer global perspective. Study Abroad destinations from recent years include Italy, Croatia, Ireland, Scotland, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Peru, and Bosnia and Herzegovina.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Craven CC's high standards in the classroom and dedicated faculty ensure a university-quality education for your first and second years of college. Extracurricular opportunities—such as the renowned chapter of Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society and the college's Honors Program—guarantee students strong interdisciplinary connections. Eligibility for these organizations and programs is available to students who complete 12 curriculum hours and earn a 3.5 GPA or higher.

EMBRACING THE ARTS

At Craven CC, we value and nurture the talents of emerging musicians and artists. Encore! is the college's singing ambassador group that performs throughout the community.

Studio art students often participate in the college's annual art show, and the winning piece is awarded the President's Art Award and becomes part of the college's permanent art collection. The collection is housed across the New Bern campus, and each piece is labeled to include the artist's name and the title of work.

WANT TO GET INVOLVED?

Students who maintain a 3.5 (B+) GPA are eligible for membership in the college's chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, the international two-year honor society.

Some students also join the Student Government Association or Hurst Student Ambassadors program, both of which provide scholarships to qualified students in exchange for their service.

STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL?

Through the Career & College Promise (CCP) program, high school students can earn eligible credits toward an associate degree. Students should contact their local high school counselors or Craven's CCP Advisor to learn more.
