
MAY 25 TO JUNE 8, 2025 - 15 DAYS

Join the Lifetime Learning Center on this customized itinerary through a crossroads of civilizations in Sicily and on to the spectacular coastlines of Southern Italy. We will uncover Sicily's capital Palermo with its Moorish and Norman influences, explore seaside Cefalù and Agrigento's ancient Valley of the Temples, travel to the historic hilltop town of Taormina, and visit a local winery for a wine tasting and "farm to table" dinner. The adventure continues to the ancient cave dwellings of Sassi di Matera. We then explore Sorrento and stunning Positano on the Amalfi Coast, walk in the footsteps of ancient Romans in the excavated Pompeii, and enjoy a guided walking tour of Classical Rome. Friday, September 6 THE LOST KING THE WEASEL'S TALE 2023 - UK - English Comedy/Drama - PG-13

Amateur historian Philippa Langley is obsessed with the mystery of King Richard III's lost remains. She conducts her own research, refusing to listen to skeptical historians. What follows is an inspirational journey that proves the power of one woman with infinite questions, searching for what's been lost for over 500 years.

Philippa believes the king's image has been tarnished by misjudgments and untruths, and she sets out to find his lost burial site to learn more and preserve his legacy. (108 minutes.)

Friday, October 4 2019 - Argentina/Spain - Spanish Comedy/Drama - NR

This dark comedy tells the story of four elderly movie industry veterans-a famous actress, her wheelchairbound husband, a screenwriter, and a director—who live together in a run-down mansion just outside of Buenos Aires. A young couple intent on acquiring the property weasel their way into this "family," setting off a shrewd and snarky game of cat and mouse.

Despite their advanced ages, these artistic residents still have their storytelling skills intact. It all results in a film that is a slick, calibrated, and classically structured dark comedy, with an up-to-date edge. 29 minutes)

Friday, November I PAST LIVES 2023 - South Korea - Korean Drama/Romance - PG-13

Nora and Hae Sung, two deeply connected childhood friends, get separated when her family emigrates from South Korea. Two decades later, they reunite in New York City for one fateful week as they confront notions of destiny, love and life choices.

In this Academy Award-nominated film, the Korean concept of "inyeon' is used to lead viewers to believe that Nora and Hae-sung are destined to be together – if not in this lifetime, then in the future. All may hope for them to have a happily-ever-after, but will they? (105 minutes)

Friday, January 3 THE PROMISED LAND 2023 - Denmark/Sweden - Danish/ Swedish - Drama/History - R

In 18th-century Denmark, impoverished war hero Capt. Ludvig Kahlen sets out to tame a vast, uninhabitable land on which seemingly nothing can grow. This beautiful but forbidding area is under the rule of Frederik De Schinkel, a merciless nobleman who realizes the threat Kahlen represents to his power.

As a new community starts to settle in, De Schinkel swears vengeance, leading to an intense confrontation between the two men. Mads Mikkelsen plays Kahlen with granitefaced strength (127 minutes)

Friday, February 7 THE EIGHT MOUNTAINS

Based on the best-selling novel by Paolo Cognetti, this film spans almost 40 years, showing a lifelong friendship between two seemingly very different people, men who became fast friends as children and remain friends, even though life, time, and circumstances often drive them apart.

This epic journey of friendship and

self-discovery is set in the breathtaking Italian Alps, and follows a profound and complex relationship between Pietro and Bruno. (147 minutes)

Friday, March 7 FALLING FOR FIGARO 2020 - UK/Scotland - English Comedy/Romance - PG-I3

Millie, a very successful fund manager, realizes one day that her life-long dream is to become an opera singer. Quitting her lucrative job and moving away from her long-term boyfriend, she travels to the Scottish Highlands where she hopes to become an opera singer following intense (and hysterical) vocal training from former opera diva Meghan Geoffrey-Bishop. She has fierce competition from other opera singers including Max, Meghan's other talented student. (104 minutes)

Friday, April 4 AND THEN CAME THE NIGHTIARS 2023 - UK/England - English Drama - NR

On his run-down south Devon farm, recently widowed Michael only has his cherished herd of cows to call family - so when foot and mouth disease creeps slowly through the valley he pulls up the drawbridge and hopes to wait it out.

Meanwhile life is hardly easy for local vet leff, who's plunged from being every farmers' best friend to cattle executioner and village persona non grata,

So the question is, can they help each other survive the storm and salvage new lives as everything they once cherished scatters in the wind? (81 minutes)

NORTH CAROLINA MUSEUM OF ART VENICE AND THE OTTOMAN EMPIRE

Saturday, November 9, 2024 - Day Trip

This ambitious, cross-cultural exhibition explores the relationship between two global superpowers, the Republic of Venice and the Ottoman Empire, over four centuries (circa 1400–1800). Through a rich body of works reflecting both Venetian and Ottoman origins, the touring exhibit documents interactions between the two rival Mediterranean states across multiple cultural arenas-political, diplomatic, economic, artistic, and technological.

The exhibit features more than 190 works in a broad range of media, drawing from the vast collections of Venice's storied civic museums, including the Museo Correr, Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo Mocenigo, and Museo Fortuny, as well as the NCMA's own extensive holdings of Venetian art. Highlights include paintings by Jacobello del Fiore, Vittore Carpaccio, and Gentile Bellini and luxury Venetian and Ottoman goods. The Venetian works are joined by a trove of recently salvaged objects from a major Adriatic shipwreck, the large Venetian merchant ship Gagliana Grossa that sank while traveling from Venice to Istanbul in 1583. These spectacular items have never been exhibited outside Croatia, where the wreck was discovered.

EXHIBITION ON SCREEN VAN GOGH: POETS & LOVERS

Two hundred years after its opening and a century after acquiring its first Van Gogh, the National Gallery hosted the UK's biggest ever Van Gogh exhibition. Van Gogh is not only one of the most beloved artists of all time, but perhaps the most misunderstood. This film is a chance to reexamine and better understand this iconic artist. Focusing on his unique creative process, Van Gogh: Poets & Lovers explores the artist's years in the south of France, where he revolutionised his style, and became consumed with a passion for the landscape.

Poets and lovers filled his imagination; everything he did in the south of France served this new obsession. In part, this is what caused his notorious breakdown, but it didn't hold back his creativity as he created masterpiece after masterpiece. Explore one of art history's most pivotal periods in this once-in-a-century show. Made in close collaboration with the National Gallery. (90 minutes)

JOHN BROWN

John Brown Big Band is a full 19-piece jazz orchestra made up of the top jazz musicians from North Carolina and beyond. The group performs a wide range of material covering all eras of jazz repertoire including the music and

arrangements of legends like Count Basie, Duke Ellington, Thad Jones, Woody Herman, and more! The band also delights in highlighting compositions of Carolina natives like John Coltrane, Thelonious Monk, Dizzy Gillespie, and Nina Simone. Bassist, composer, educator, actor, and Jazz ambassador John Brown leads the band. A native of Fayetteville, NC, John's extensive experience includes performances at notable venues like Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, the Blue Note, Blues Alley, and the Hollywood Bowl as well as major jazz festivals like the Playboy Jazz Festival, the JVC Jazz Festival, the Montreal Jazz Festival, the Free Jazz Festival (Brazil) and Jazz e Vienne (France).

He currently serves as Vice Provost for the Arts, Director of the Jazz Program and Professor of the Practice of Music at Duke University, and has served on the faculties of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, North Carolina State University, North Carolina Central University and Guilford College (NC).

John and his musicians are committed to jazz education. As Professor and Director of the Jazz Program at Duke University, he makes education a part of his daily life. He and members of the band will present a Jazz workshop for area high school music students during the band's visit to New Bern.

Day and Regional Trip Registration

Enrollment space for LLC day trips and regional travel programs is limited to the capacity of our motor coach, the availability of tickets and other booking factors associated with group admissions. To reserve a place on any of these trips, ALL fees must be paid at the time of registration. Early registration is highly recommended as the trips tend to "sell out" very quickly.

USA Adventures and International Travel

Registration deposits, fees, and final payments for out-of-state or out-of-country travel, where the LLC contracts with a tour company, will follow a payment schedule specific to each trip. Payments for these trips are paid directly to one of our group travel partners. Rules for refunds, travel insurance requirements, and the specific details for each trip will be printed in separate tour brochures

Please note that Craven Community College requires that each person participating in an extended trip must sign a liability waiver and purchase cancellation and post-departure emergency insurance. We offer a reasonably priced option with each trip that we sponsor. Participants who have other travel insurance coverage may opt-out of our offer but they are required to provide Craven Community College with proof of insurance that specifically documents insurance coverage equivalent to our minimum standards.



Refund Policy

Tickets purchased for Explorations in the Arts events or our **Performance Day Trips are NOT refundable.** However, tickets and registrations are transferable. If you are unable to attend an event that you have registered and paid for, you are welcome to share your ticket(s) or transfer the registration to another person.

There are no refunds offered after an event has occurred. A refund of fees to a registered participant will only occur when a cancellation is made in advance of the event AND a replacement from the waiting list registers for the open spot. We understand that "life happens," so **please contact us as soon** as possible if last-minute circumstances arise. We often have an extensive waiting list for each trip and we will attempt to fill a spot if we are notified.

One-to four-day trip registration fees are NOT refundable. These are the exceptions: I) the predetermined minimum enrollment is not met and the trip is cancelled due to low enrollment; or 2) the college or the performance/ exhibit venue determines that due to threatening weather or unsafe conditions we must cancel. No refunds will be offered if a new date is selected and the program is completed as advertised.
