LAAPATAA LADIES

2024 - India - Hindi Comedy/Drama - TV-I4

Deepak, a farmer, travels back from the big city to his small village in India with Phool, his new bride. They travel aboard a crowded passenger train filled to the brim with many other newlywed couples.

When they arrive at their destination, Deepak mistakenly gets off the train with the wrong bride, leaving his new wife behind with another groom.

The family welcomes the wrong bride. Meanwhile, Phool discovers the mix-up and, refusing to return home and bring shame to her family, she decides to stay at the station, hoping her groom will rescue her.

The ensuing events are humorous and poignant, leading the characters on an unexpected journey. (122 minutes)

NOWHERE SPECIAL

2020 - UK/ Ireland - English Drama - NR

When John (James Norton), a thirty-four-year-old window cleaner, learns he has only a few months to live, he tries desperately to find the perfect family for his three-year-old son, Michael.

During a series of auditions, various potential parental pairs come forward, but most turn out to be unsuitable. One exception is a woman who, after giving up a child for adoption as a teenager, learned she couldn't have biological children.

With sympathetic acquaintances and eager social workers urging him to choose, John feels immense pressure, as this decision is crucial for Michael's future. (118 minutes)

THE BELIER FAMILY

2014 - France - French/Sign Language/Spanish/English Comedy/Drama/Music - NR

For the Bélier family, sixteen-year-old Paula is the essential interpreter for her deaf parents and brother. Despite her family's inability to hear, Paula has a notable talent for singing and is rehearsing iconic French songs with her choir. Her teacher encourages her to audition for a prestigious music college in Paris, which could pave the way for a promising future.

Paula tries to balance her family responsibilities, all while dealing with her demanding music teacher and a crush on Gabriel, the other star of the school choir. Will Paula leave her family for a future in music? (106 minutes)

THE GOOD BOSS

2022 - Spain - Spanish/Arabic Comedy/Drama - NR

The Good Boss takes place at the Blancos Básculas factory, where maintaining balance is essential, as they manufacture scales of all shapes and sizes. The seemingly benevolent boss (Javier Bardem) is preparing his workforce for an upcoming inspection by a group visiting local businesses who will select one for a prestigious award.

Tensions escalate when José, a recently fired employee, appears with his two children and demands to be reinstated. As the story unfolds, it's discovered that questionable practices have occurred. How good of a boss is he really? Dive into the complexities of a workplace where management claims to "treat employees like family." (116 minutes)

2022 - UK/England - English Costume Drama/Romance - PG

Clergyman's daughter Selina Dolton and aristocrat Julia Thistlewaite have been best friends since their time at boarding school. When ambitious Julia begs Selina for help dispensing revenge after being rejected by the elusive Jeremy Malcolm, Selina eagerly agrees to assist her.

The wealthy Mr. Malcolm has compiled a list of attributes and qualities that any potential bride must possess. Julia and her cousin Lord Cassidy enlist Selina's help, hoping that Mr. Malcolm might be captivated by her charm and beauty. However, things take an unexpected turn when Selina confesses her genuine feelings for Mr. Malcolm. (117 minutes)

THE LAST RIFLEMAN

2023 - UK/Ireland - English Drama - PG-13

Artie Crawford (Pierce Brosnan) is a World War II veteran living in a care home in Northern Ireland who has just lost his wife. He is also experiencing unsettling flashbacks from the war. On the 75th anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, Artie decides to escape the care home to embark on a challenging journey to France. His goal is to pay his final respects to his best friend and find the courage to confront the ghosts of his past.

Throughout his journey, Artie relies on the kindness of strangers and encounters unique challenges, all while grappling with memories from his past. (116 minutes)

THE ROAD DANCE

2021 - UK/Scotland - English Drama - NR

Kirsty is a young woman living in Garenin with her widowed mother and sister. She dreams of moving to America with her boyfriend, Murdo, but their plans are abruptly interrupted when he and other young men are called to serve in The Great War.

The town holds a cèilidh to honor them before they leave the following day. Later that night, Kirsty is attacked by an unknown assailant. An examination by the village doctor reveals that she has been raped. The police are brought in to investigate, leading to numerous challenges for Kirsty as she navigates her emotions, faces difficult decisions, and learns to cope with the trauma she endures. 

The final collaboration between Richard Rodgers & Oscar Hammerstein II, **THE SOUND OF MUSIC** has become a play beloved around the world.

Based on the true story of the Von Trapp Family Singers, this play captures a personal tale of growth and hope amidst the horrors of World War II.

The musical tells the tale of young postulant Maria, whose free spirit has trouble fitting into the rules and regulations of Nonnberg Abbey. Commissioned by the Mother Abbess to serve as the governess for seven motherless children, Maria transforms the Von Trapp family home from a place of dour rules and regulations to one filled with joy, laughter, and music. In the process, Maria wins the hearts of all seven children and their widower father, Captain Von Trapp.

Broadway's longest-running American musical, **CHICAGO** is a dazzling and satirical look at fame, justice, and the media machine.

Set in 1920s Chicago and based on real-life murders and trials, *CHICAGO* follows Roxie Hart, a wannabe vaudevillian star who murders her lover and is arrested, despite her attempts to convince her pushover husband, Amos, to lie for her.

In the Cook County Jail, Roxie meets her hero, the famed double-murderess and nightclub performer Velma Kelly. When both acquire the same lawyer, the greedy and lustful superstar, Billy Flynn, tensions come to a head as they vie for the spotlight - though instead of an onstage rivalry, they're mugging for the flashbulbs and attention of the newspaper reporters. With catchy, sexy music and timeless lyrics paired with choreography by Bob Fosse, **CHICAGO** is a musical spectacular that is as addictive as gossip rags and as unforgettable as any trial of the century.

HAMILTON


History Has Its Eyes on You

In the process, Hamilton powerfully shaped America -- and gave us all a template for what it means to pull ourselves up by our bootstraps and realize the American Dream.

A FREE lecture event presented in partnership with The English-Speaking Union, Colonial NC Branch in celebration of Veterans Day.

Steve Taylor is a retired United States Marine Corps Colonel, serving from 1975 until 2003. He was a helicopter pilot and spent two tours in Marine Helicopter Squadron One – also known as HMX-I – which is the Marine squadron tasked with flying the President, Vice President, and other dignitaries. From 1983 to 1988, he served as a pilot during the Reagan administration. He returned to HMX-1 in 2000 and was the commanding officer and presidential helicopter pilot for George W. Bush from 2001 until 2003. Steve will speak about his experiences flying the President and particularly about his experience surrounding the events of 9/11/2001.

NORTH CAROLINA MUSEUM OF ART ART IN BLOOM

Art in Bloom is an annual five-day festival at the North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA) that features floral interpretations of artwork from the museum's collection. Floral designers from across the state and the nation create unique arrangements inspired by pieces in the NCMA's People's Collection.

Before the main attraction, we will visit the J.C. Raulston Arboretum at NC State University. This Arboretum is a nationally acclaimed teaching and research garden dedicated to promoting a greater diversity of landscape plants. It's named in honor of its late director and founder, Dr. J. C. Raulston, renowned plantsman and professor of horticultural science at NC State. The visit will include a guided tour of the arboretum, with time to explore additional sections of the 10.5 acres of gardens to discover plants collected from around the world.

The story of Christ's crucifixion and resurrection has dominated western culture for the past 2000 years. It is perhaps the most significant historical event of all time, as recounted by the gospels but equally as depicted by the greatest artists in history. From the triumphant to the savage, the ethereal to the tactile, some of western civilization's greatest artworks focus on this pivotal moment. This beautifully crafted film directed by Phil Grabsky explores the Easter story as depicted in art, from the time of the early Christians to the present day. From the nascent sound of bluegrass that charmed hardscrabble hillbilly honky-tonks, rural schoolhouse stages, and the crowning glory of the Grand Ole Opry to the present-day culture-buzz of viral videos and digital streams, Del is the living link. On prime time and late-night television talk shows, there is Del. From headlining sold-out concerts to music festivals of all genres, including one carrying his namesake, there is Del. Where audiences number in the tens of thousands, and admirers as diverse as country-rock icon Steve Earle and jamband royalty Phish count as a few among hundreds, there is Del.

Now helming the Del McCoury Band, with sons Ronnie and Rob, the ensemble continues to represent in a larger, growing musical community, a peerless torchbearer for the entire sweep and scope of bluegrass history. Those many years, not to mention a good-natured willingness to stay alert to the latest sounds and opportunities around him, earned McCoury a whole new generation of fans, including some in unlikely places.



And like any genuine treasure, the gifts keep coming. On their latest release, *Songs of Love and Life*, a glorious 15-song collection, features Del touching down on a diverse set of tracks--vintage and contemporary.



Join us for an unforgettable evening with Black Box Dance Theatre (BBDT) a Raleigh-based professional modern dance company known for its powerful storytelling, emotionally compelling performances, and commitment to making dance relevant, accessible, and transformative. Founded in 2014, BBDT uses movement as a catalyst for connection—building bridges across communities, disciplines, and lived experiences.

BBDT has been nationally recognized for their groundbreaking work with veterans and the military community. Since 2019, the company has partnered with the NC Arts Council, the USO, and veteran organizations to develop PATRIOT—an ongoing multimedia performance project honoring the service, sacrifice, and stories of veterans, active duty personnel, and their families.

To start we invite you to a free screening of the documentary film *I Feel Myself* To Be Part Of Something, directed by Lou Pepe. Part of a new national anthology curated by Mara Isaacs (Hades Town), the film follows three veterans as they journey through a week of collaborative dance-making with BBDT artists. It offers an intimate view into the transformative power of art, community, and shared storytelling. A discussion will follow the the 4:00 p.m. screening.

Then at 7:30 p.m., join us for the main attraction, an evening performance that will feature excerpts from *PATRIOT'S PATH*, a compelling new chapter of the PATRIOT series, blending original choreography with first hand narratives of resilience, healing and hope.

A NORTH CAROLINA HOLIDAY FOUR-DAY TOUR

December 14-17, 2025

On this four-day adventure participants will travel to central and western North Carolina to celebrate the holidays. The tour features sites, sounds, and tastes along the way and includes tours of historic homes, fine dining, a special exhibition, and more!

We depart on December 14, with a first stop in Raleigh to experience fine dining at Rey's Restaurant. With appetites satisfied, we head to the Chinese Lantern Festival to enjoy the light displays. The evening will end with a one-night stay in Cary.

Following breakfast, Monday's schedule begins with a visit to Murray's Mill Historic Site in Catawba County, where we'll explore the Mill, general store, and historic home. PROGRAM PARTICIPATION & REGISTRATION EVENTS

Day and Regional Trip Registration

Enrollment space for LLC day trips and regional travel programs is limited to the capacity of our motor coach, the availability of tickets, and other booking factors associated with group admissions. To reserve a place on any of these trips, ALL fees must be paid at the time of registration. Early registration is highly recommended as the trips tend to sell out very quickly.

To register and pay fees online, visit our website at www.CravenCC.edu/LLC. From the left column select "Registration and Tickets," then scroll down the page until you find the event that interests you. Follow the instructions to enter your payment information.

If you have questions about the online process or would prefer to register by telephone or send a payment by check, please call us at (252) 638-7351 for assistance. Our office hours are Monday to Thursday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Friday, 8 a.m. to Noon.

USA Adventures and International Travel

Registration deposits, fees, and final payments for out-of-state or out-of-country travel, where the LLC contracts with a tour company, will follow a payment schedule specific to each trip. Payments for these trips are paid directly to one of our group travel partners. Rules for refunds, travel insurance requirements, and the specific details for each trip will be printed in separate tour brochures.

Please note that Craven Community College requires that each person participating in an extended trip must sign a liability waiver and purchase cancellation and post-departure emergency insurance. We offer a reasonably priced option with each trip that we sponsor. Participants who have other travel insurance coverage may decline our offer, but they are required to provide Craven Community College with proof of insurance that specifically documents insurance coverage equivalent to our minimum standards.

Refund Policy

Tickets purchased for Explorations in the Arts events or our Performance Day Trips are NOT refundable. However, tickets and registrations are transferable. If you are unable to attend an event that you have registered and paid for, you are welcome to share your ticket(s) or transfer the registration to another person.

There are no refunds offered after an event has occurred. A **refund of fees to a registered participant will only occur** when a cancellation is made in advance of the event **AND** a replacement from the waiting list registers for the open spot. We understand that "life happens," so **please contact us as soon as possible if last-minute circumstances arise.** We often have an extensive waiting list for each trip and we will attempt to fill a spot if we are notified.

One-to four-day trip registration fees are NOT refundable. These are the exceptions: I) the predetermined minimum enrollment is not met and the trip is cancelled due to low enrollment; or 2) the college or the performance/ exhibit venue determines that due to threatening weather or unsafe conditions we must cancel. No refunds will be offered if a new date is selected and the program is completed as advertised.
